



FERN GLADE | MARAKOOPA CAVE

A short walk along Marakoopa Creek in the Mole Creek Karst National Park.

This rainforest walk is located at the Marakoopa Cave Office in Mayberry and is 30 minutes return.



Time: 30 minute return
Distance: 1.2km return



Take the B12 (C38) west from Mole Creek. Turn left at the Marakoopa Cave sign into Mayberry Rd and follow the road to the end where the cave ticket office is located. Roads are sealed.

There are toilets and a gift shop at the Parks & Wildlife ticket office. Cafes and accommodation can be found in Mole Creek and surrounds.



Grade 2: Suitable for most ages. The track has a hardened or compacted surface that may have a gentle hill section or sections, and occasional steps.



Supervise young children; the track follows a creek with sometimes fast flowing water.

Fern Glade Walk is a short walk which starts at the Marakoopa Cave ticket office and leads to the cave entrance, following Marakoopa creek as it tumbles down the hillside from inside the cave itself.

There is usually an abundance of colourful fungi lining the track, especially during autumn and winter, as well as numerous species of fern and rainforest plants such as native myrtle beech, often covered with moss and lichen.

You can enjoy this walk for its own sake, or as a part of your cave experience. Just leave yourself 15 minutes before your cave tour departure time and leave your car at the ticket office carpark, rather than driving up to the cave entrance.

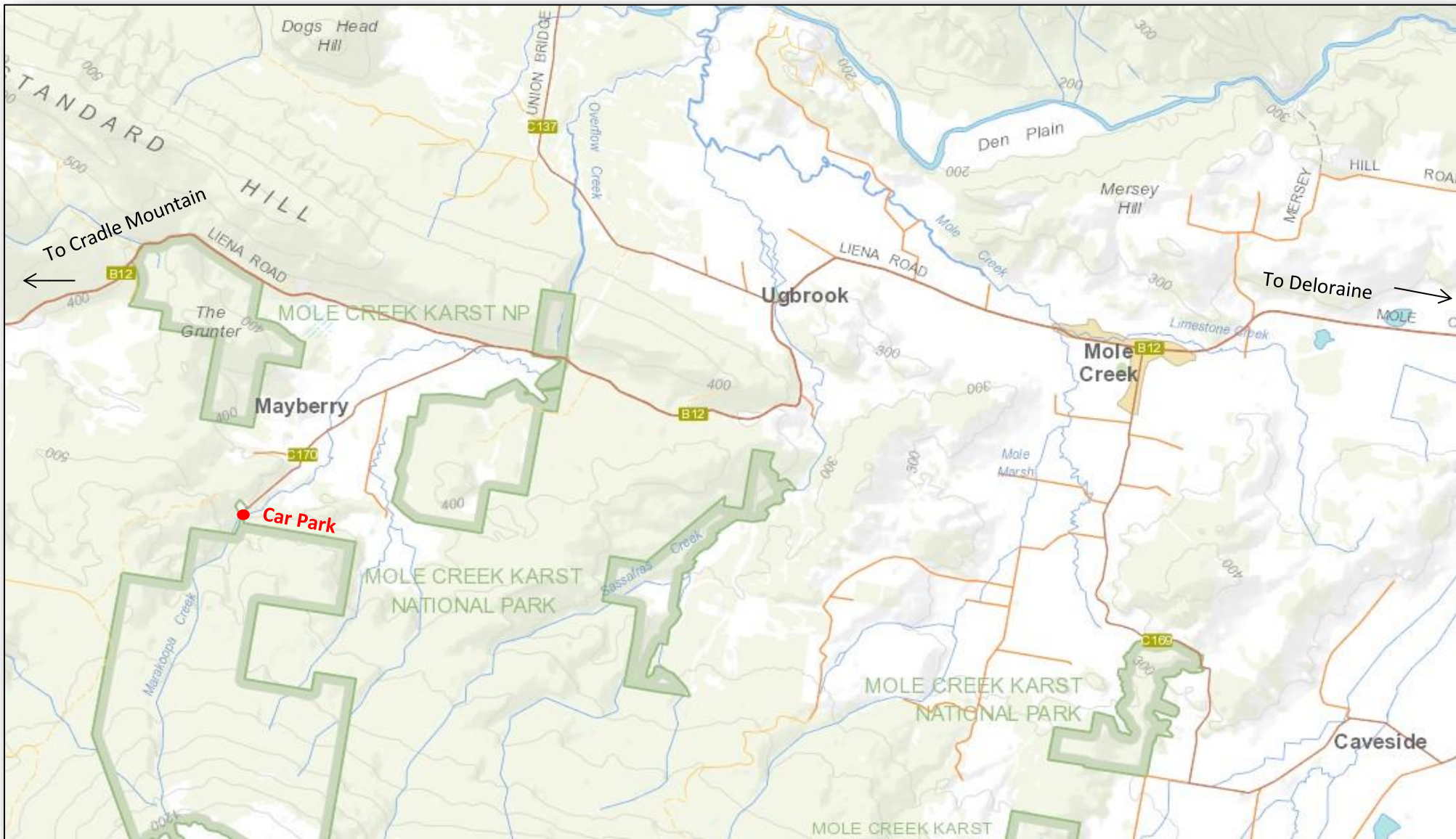

SAFE WALKING: Plan, be prepared, walk with friends, tell someone where you are going. Consider hiring an EPIRB from Service Tasmania (Launceston & Devonport) to prepare for emergency events. Make a personal determination as to your fitness and ability to undertake specific walks.

LEAVE NO TRACE: walk on formed tracks, observe all restrictions, dispose of waste properly and leave what you find.
