A peaceful shaded walk through stands of native and European trees in a 14 acre tranquil setting by the Meander River in Deloraine. Dogs on leads are welcome and please be mindful of the native potoroos and other wildlife that live in the wood.


The Wild Wood is a nature reserve of 5.7 hectares (14 acres) that runs alongside the Meander River west of the Deloraine Apex Caravan Park. The reserve is part of a low river flood plain with old-growth native olive trees, swamp peppermints, deciduous beech, mature oaks and sycamore groves.

to flooding. Beware of snakes in summer in the Wild Wood.

The best parking is at the Train Park in West Parade.

Take the path under the road bridge and follow the river through to the Apex Caravan Park. At around 800m you will find the entrance to the Rotary Wild Wood Nature Reserve. There are multiple paths within the reserve which are shared between dog walkers, runners and cyclists. On the walk back, cross the green foot bridge and follow the river back over the suspension bridge to enjoy the sculptures, gardens and abundant wildlife of the <u>Deloraine Riverbank</u>.
